End of Term Update - Autumn Term 1

Dear Parents and Carers,

As we reach the end of the first half of the autumn term, I want to take a moment to thank you for your continued support and to reflect on what has been a fantastic start to the academic year here at Scalby Secondary Academy.

We are now eight weeks into the term, and I'm proud to say that our students have settled in brilliantly. Across the school, routines and expectations have been embedded with consistency and care. From the moment students enter the classroom, they are focused—planners and equipment out, titles and dates written, and straight into learning through our daily 'drill' activities. These small habits are helping build a strong culture of learning and purpose.

Year 11 Trial Exams & Mentoring

This half term has seen our Year 11 students preparing for and sitting trial exams in English, Maths, and Science. Staff have worked incredibly hard to support students through revision sessions, Walking Talking Mocks, and pre-exam breakfasts. These efforts have helped ensure students feel confident and prepared—thank you to everyone involved.
