Week Commencing: Monday 1st December

Firstly, thank you for your support during the recent snowy weather.

Following the challenges caused by the snowy conditions two weeks ago, we would like to extend our appreciation once again for your patience and understanding. Despite difficult travel across Scarborough, staff worked tirelessly to ensure that the academy remained open and safe. A special thank you goes to our site team, who were in early each morning clearing and gritting pathways and ensuring the grounds were safe for students and staff. Our teaching and support staff also demonstrated real commitment in maintaining a calm, structured environment throughout the disruption. We are incredibly grateful for the collective effort across our school community.

We are now in a busy period of assessment across the school Year 10 & 11 trial exams and key stage 3 assessments across all of the EBACC subjects. Our Year 11 Trial Exams are progressing well, and students have approached them with maturity and determination. These assessments provide essential preparation ahead of next summer's GCSEs. At the same time, Key Stage 3 core assessments in English, Maths, Science, Geography, History, French and Computer Science are also underway. These help us track progress closely and ensure that each student receives the support and encouragement they need. Parents will receive feedback on these assessments at the end of January when reports are sent home. Thank you for continuing to encourage students to arrive prepared and ready to do their best.

As we move into the final month of term, we have taken the time to revisit key expectations with students. This includes: Behaviour standards, Uniform, Equipment, Movement around school and Conduct during assessments.




# <u>Year 9 Holland Trip:</u> A Journey Through History, Wonder and Wildlife

Our Year 9 students recently returned from an unforgettable educational trip to the Netherlands, where they explored the rich tapestry of Dutch history, culture, and nature. Over four action-packed days, they visited poignant memorials, thrilling theme parks, and immersive wildlife exhibits—each day offering new experiences and lasting memories.

#### 📍 Day 1: Reflecting at Camp Vught and Overloon War Museum












# Performing Arts & Music Department

# FEAST Information

Redeem your vouchers for free holiday activities this Christmas.

We have issued FEAST vouchers to all families whose children/young people receive benefits-related free school meals. These vouchers entitle your child to free places on FEAST activities this Christmas holiday, where they'll also receive a free heathy meal.

You should have received this voucher via email or text, from a platform called HolidayActivities. Follow the link to redeem your voucher and book your child's place on some of the fantastic activities on offer in our area.

Please note that this Christmas, families can request places from Monday 17 November, but bookings won't be confirmed until Friday 21 November. This short wait gives everyone time to browse activities and express interest before places are allocated. You should hear back within a week to let you know if your child has a place. This new approach helps make things fairer, giving every family an equal chance to enjoy FEAST activities and meals.
